## **Ready, Respectful, Safe**

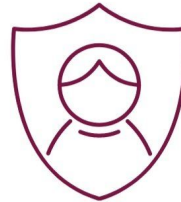

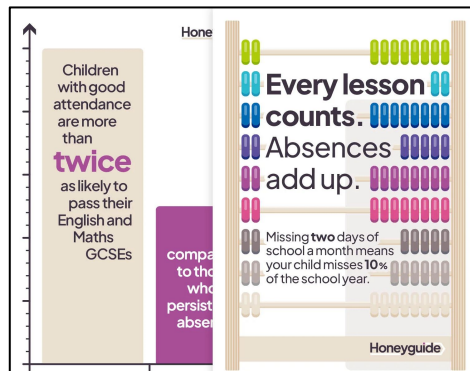

## **Medication/Allergies:**

We offer a range of sports, creative and academic based clubs for children across the school.

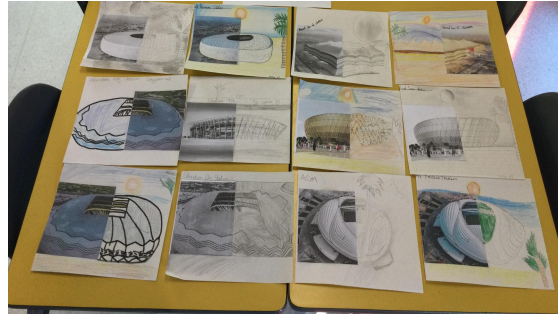

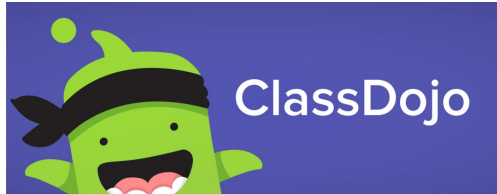

# Banding Information:

- Banding is used at secondary transfer to help to ensure that secondary schools maintain a balanced admission intake. This should reflect the full range of abilities of all children in the local authority.
- Pupil assessment from each primary school in the Autumn Term of Year 6 is used to place every pupil in one of four quartiles. For administrative purposes, the quartiles are Band A, B, C or D.
- This year, banding will be completed in Year 6, online and in groups.



# Banding Information:

Pupils are assigned their Band based on a Digital CATS4 assessment that they complete in the Autumn Term of their Year 6. This is explained as follows:

CATS4 is a cognitive ability test that assesses a pupil's ability in four areas:

- Verbal Reasoning – the ability to express ideas and reason through words
- Non-verbal Reasoning – problem-solving using pictures and diagrams
- Spatial Reasoning – to look at a shape and imagine what it would look like from different angle
- Quantitative Reasoning – the ability to use numerical skills to solve a mathematical problem.

Pupils complete a digital (online) test made up of eight sections, split across three 'parts.' Each 'part' takes approximately 45 minutes. It is taken on either an iPad, PC or laptop.

## **What to do if you do not live in Tower Hamlets:**

- If you do not live in Tower Hamlets, but want to apply to a Tower Hamlets School, you will need to apply online following the instructions issued by your home borough. You will also need to complete the Tower Hamlets supplementary form.
- If you do not live in Tower Hamlets and want to apply for a school in your home borough, you will need to apply online following the instructions issued by your home borough. Contact your local borough admissions team and request their Secondary School brochure.
- Some schools require additional forms to be completed. These are called supplementary forms – please check with the school if they require one.

## **What to do if you live in Tower Hamlets but want to apply to a school that is not in Tower Hamlets:**

- You must still use the Tower Hamlets admission process, listing the schools you are wanting your child to attend. Please ensure there are no additional forms required for the school outside of Tower Hamlets.

- Y6 SATs are nothing to worry about!
- We see them as an opportunity for the children to show what they can do.
- And by the time we get to SATs Week, the children will be ready to show what they can do .
- The children's results give them confidence - they can see the progress that they've made during their time at Marner - and move onto their secondary schools ready to build on all their learning.
- At Marner we celebrate the 'whole child' - SATs are one of the ways we celebrate the children. They work hard at Marner and are so proud of the progress that they make.

## What you can do at home to support the children:

- Please make sure your child is reading at home every night – reading is the secret to success at Primary and Secondary School
- Ask them about what they're reading – they could summarise the last chapter they read

- If they've been selected for Boosters, make sure they attend every week.
