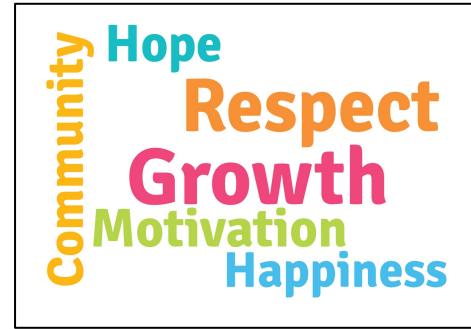

Ready, Respectful, Safe

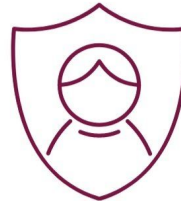

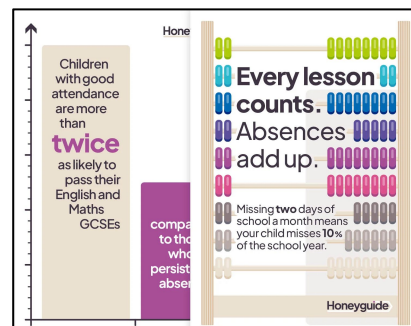
Attending primary school regularly provides a wealth of social, health and academic benefits for children.

Medication/Allergies:

If your child has medication that they need to have in school, it is your responsibility to make sure it is in school. Please hand it in to the school office who will pass this on – you will need to fill in an updated form.

If your child previously had an allergy, please make sure this information is also updated via the school office.

Children who have allergies wear a lanyard at lunchtimes, listing their allergies, so that all kitchen staff are aware.

School Uniform

- A blue sweatshirt (with or without the school logo).
- A white polo shirt (with or without the school logo).
- Black trousers, skirt, or pinafore. Skirts and pinafores should be knee-length or longer.
- Black shoes that are flat, sensible, and fully enclosed. Trainers are allowed if all black.
- Socks or tights must be plain black, white, or grey.
- School bags should be big enough to fit an A4 homework book in.

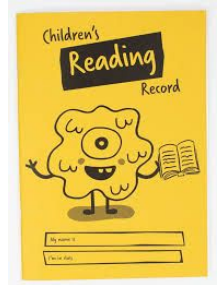

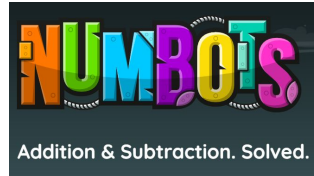

1. Daily: Reading – read out loud to someone at home for **20 minutes each day**, about what you've just read and fill in your reading record.













Reading books will be given out on a **FRIDAY** and collected on a **WEDNESDAY**

This term we will be looking at the core texts: Owl Babies, You Choose, Be You!, and Sharing a Shell.



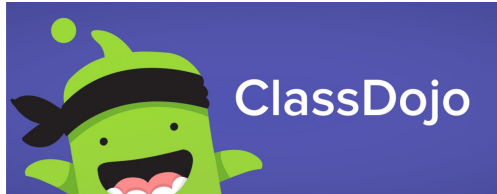
