

Department for Education

Twinning Programme

We were visited by a team from the Department for Education on Tuesday 13th January. They were carrying out research into Twinning Schools. The team were keen to speak to children, teachers and SLT members to gather their views on whether twinning with another school would be a positive experience. They asked about twinning with schools in other countries, other parts of the UK, which subjects they would like to focus on, how meetings/sharing would take place.

The D for E were impressed with our year 5 and 6 Marner pupils, who were articulate and respectful. They gave considered opinions and asked for clarification when unsure about any points.

Marner was then invited to pilot the programme and will be focusing on Reading and will be twinning with a school in Northern Ireland.

Homework at Marner

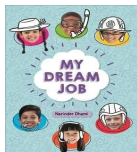

Wondermaths Programme

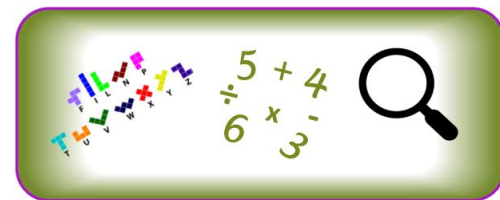


For a number of years now, Marner has been a part of the Wondermaths programme, formally known as Count On Us which was part of the Mayor's Fund for London. Wondermaths is a challenge designed to motivate young mathematicians, exciting them with problem-based maths activities and fast paced mental arithmetic tasks.

Pupils will gain confidence by working through maths problems, taking risks and thinking outside the box, to find solutions in challenging activities. The programme encourages pupils to work collaboratively, sharing ideas, listening to each other, as well as individually, challenging themselves. Last year, thanks to the dedication of Ms Aleks, who runs the scheme, Marner became the heats winners and got to take part in the grand final in Central London.

Marner granted special access to Simon Singh's Parallel Academy. The Parallel Academy is an online school of excellence and provides a range of programmes to stretch students beyond the school curriculum.

Due to Marner's involvement in Wondermaths, we have been granted special access to Simon Singh's Parallel Academy.

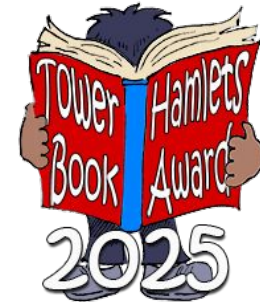

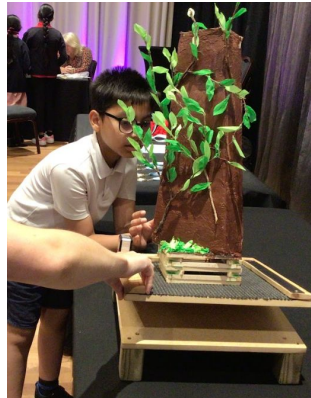


Primary Engineering Programme

The Primary Engineer programme provides fully funded STEM projects for primary and secondary schools in London, engaging pupils and teachers with engineering businesses, skills, and technology. The programme aims to promote engineering careers, develop engineering skills in teachers, and address inequalities in engineering. It uses a project-based learning approach, integrating practical maths, science, creative problem-solving, and literacy, and is often referred to as "STEM by Stealth" due to its integrated curriculum.

Bringing Engineering into the classroom

We won the overall award for best structure because of the stability of the design after it was tested. We also won an award for best design Idea.



STEM Masterclasses

The Royal Institution, based in Central London, delivers Saturday morning Masterclasses for Year 5 students. These extracurricular workshops are in mathematics and computer science. They nurture students' curiosity and inspire them to continue STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) engagement into the future. Through these Masterclasses, students connect with scientists and STEM enthusiasts, gaining insight into the depth and breadth of these fields. Students are helped to realise that STEM subjects are for everyone, inspiring future science careers.



Marnier nominates a small group of year 5 students who have an emerging interest in STEM subjects to attend. Pupils who have attended this year are:

Saara Ahmed (Justice), who said,

'I loved the magic science tricks through puzzles, I found it a little bit challenging but really enjoyed it'.

Ayman Hasan (Justice) added,

'We created coding and developed a new version for a programme called Flock XR, we also created our own AI'.

Issa Joadat and Kayden Ravat (Empower) said,

'We loved the challenging maths games, they were smart and at a high level'.

PE at Marner

At our school, PE is a valued part of the curriculum and supports children's health, confidence and wellbeing. We aim to inspire a lifelong love of physical activity through high-quality, inclusive PE lessons and a wide range of sporting opportunities.

We use the **RealPE** scheme of work to ensure lessons are engaging and accessible for all pupils. Children also benefit from a strong programme of extra-curricular clubs, including football (boys and girls), multi-sports, basketball and climbing, with opportunities to gain NICAS climbing awards.

Additional specialist provision includes Year 5 swimming, tennis coaching for all year groups and Platform Cricket coaches for Year 4. Pupils can also represent the school in borough-wide competitions such as athletics, cross country, football and basketball.

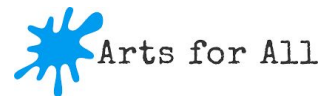

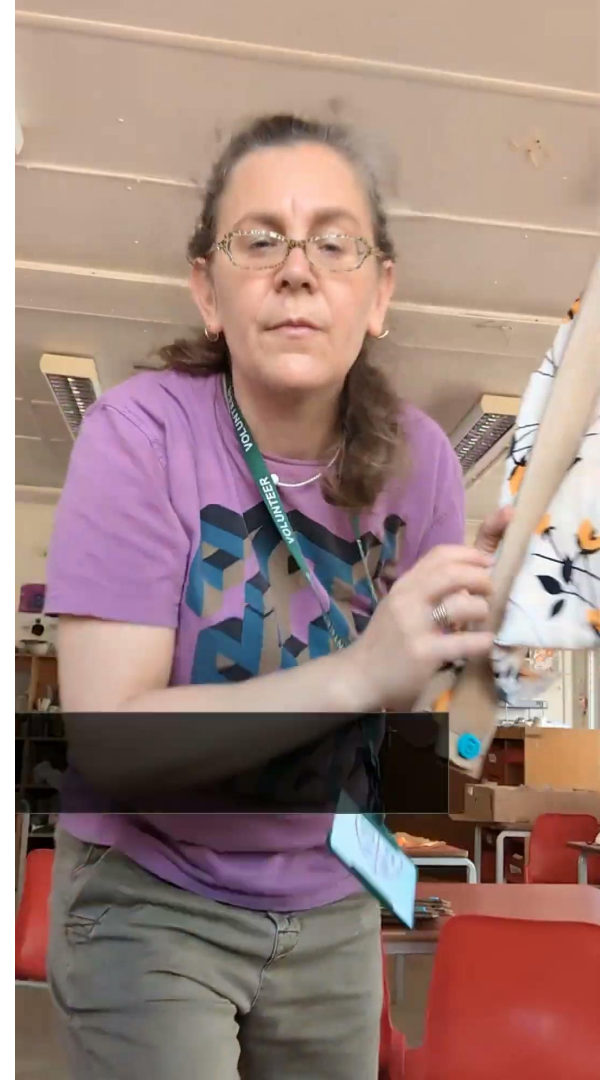
