# *PE and Sports Premium Spend Plan*



## **Vision**

ALL pupils leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

## **Objective**

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport against 5 key indicators.

1. Increase regular physical activity: Enhance the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. Raise the profile of PE and sport: Elevate the status of PE and sport across the school to support whole-school improvement.
3. Improve staff confidence and knowledge: Boost the confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sports.
4. Offer a broader range of activities: Provide all pupils with a broader and more balanced experience of different sports and physical activities.
5. Increase participation in competitive sport: Provide all pupils with greater opportunities to participate in competitive sport.

## **Background**

PE and Sport is held in high regard at Marnar Primary as we believe the benefits of a healthy and active pupil community reach beyond sport itself. There is a strong PE Team under the direction of Liam Howley, who provides PE lessons, extra-curricular clubs and a wide variety of competitive and non-competitive sporting opportunities at school and beyond. Liam Howley also supports staff through CPD and coaching, ensuring high-quality teaching across the school.
